








#### Trans victims of crimes are not able to rely on their rights.

According to the Fundamental Rights Agency 2019 Survey, only 22% of trans respondents who experienced physical or sexual assault in the past five years reported it to any authority, and only 14% to the police. One in three trans respondents did not report an attack to the police out of fear of a transphobic response.

### Recommendations

- Fund grassroots organizations that offer peer-to-peer support groups, accompaniment and counselling.
- If you are providing support, keep in mind the intersections: For migrants is often more difficult due to language barriers. For criminalized communities, fear to punishment or persecution affect severely their decision to report (Sex workers, Drug users, Undocumented migrants, etc).
- Actively deconstruct the blindfolds put on you by your own privileges: Cis,
   Male, Hetero, European, White, Able, Neurotypical, HIV negative, Economical, etc.
- Advocate for higher availability and accessibility to rights and services. Legal Gender Recognition and Gender Affirming Care reduce hate crimes (why? Increases perception of guvernamental support; naturalizes the trans experiences; "passing" reduces risks of violence).

### Recommendations

- Advocate to increase visibility of trans people in your own institutions.
- Secure the right to gather and allow demonstrations when Hate Crimes occur.
- Fund research led by CSO that are TRANS-LED.
- Widespread info on how to respond to attacks and how to report them.
- Create pressure in your local politicians and advocate for the creation of Anti-Hate Crime/Speech Laws and Policies Tackling Hatred as mentioned in TRIM.
- Advocate for asylum laws and policies that include gender identity and segregate trans refugees based on their gender identity.
- Advocate for the decriminalization of diverse gender identities and sex work, and for the creation of harm reduction programms.
