Prof. Dr. Eva Groß is a sociologist and criminologist. She worked as a research assistant at the Institute for Interdisciplinary Research on Conflict and Violence at Bielefeld University (2008-2015), and at the Criminological Research Centre of the Lower Saxony Criminal Police Office (2015-2018). Since December 2018 she holds professorship in criminology and sociology at the Hamburg University of Applied Police Sciences.
